ORGANIZED

After more than a year of study and planning, Your 3-B League was officially organized August 28, 1957 by your General Manager, Commissioners and Secretary-Treasurer. The program has progressed rapidly, with more than 90 boys registered, and the team managers, etc., have been selected. The league is patterened after the Major Leagues including a farm club. We have a director of athletics and training, team physician, business director, legal counsel, Farm club director, coaches, scouts, etc.

With such a fine compliment of capable men at the helm you can readily see that the program is certain to succeed and grow. All it needs is the "Crowning touch"...YOUR support! Any program needs the ACTIVE participation of its people, not only by contributions, but by game and practice attendance. Remember, this is YOUR LEAGUE and will guide, direct and encourage boys in good sportsmanship and build character while they are developing into manhood. Our boys need this program so let's all get behind it and give it a BIG BOOST.

MACOBS (MANAGERS AND QUACHES ORGANIZATIONAL BOOSTERS)

This is the organizational part of Your 3-B League. All parents and adults should join the Bedford MACOBS (or whatever name you decide later to call it). Membership is FREE! All you do is attend the games and one meeting a month. These are held on the second Wednesday of each month, at 7:30 P.W. in the High School on Douglas Road. There will be only one more meeting this spring, before the baseball season starts and that on May 14th. This to discuss plans for continuing this organization again in the fall, perhaps in September. Come to this last meeting...you will enjoy it. If you cannot come, we will see you at the game!

DO YOU KNOW A BOY?

Do you know a boy the has nothing to do? He may be your son Or a neighbor to you.

EXPLANATION

LEAGUE PICTURES - These are only age-group pictures.

TEAMS - Every player must earn his position on a team just like the major leagues. EACH boy has a chance! He will be coached and trained during practice tryouts. This is part of your league program to develop a boy's ability, competitive spirit and sportsmanship. We who are adults, know how important these three qualities are in later life and when cur boys go out to face the world and discover that Dad and Mom can no longer make his decisions.

FARM CLUB - Purpose is to help the boy who has never played base-ball or has played very little. He is an important part of the 3-B League. Here, his competitive spirit is protected because he is playing and training with boys who are his equal in ability.

Parks - Unless Carr Park can be used to build a ball diamond, or some other area in Temperance developed, Your 3-B teams will travel to Samaria, Erie and Lambertville for practice games. We plan to use the new High School diamond for the Junior and Senior games if it is completed by May 10th or 15th.

LEAGUE GAMES - Will be played in West Toledo, Trilby and, possibly, Sylvania. Schedules and field locations will be available at your Commissioners' business offices to all those who sign and send in their pledges and donations.

PRACTICE GAMES - Certain of these and Home games will be played in full uniform with Trilby, Ida and, possibly, Sylvania at the parks stated above. The Minors will play at Samaria, Erie and Lambertville.

TROPHIES - One trophy to each of the following:

- 1. The team that wins the most games.
- 2. The team that draws the most spectators support over the season. (Decision by 3-B Officials)
- The most improved player on each team (decision by Managers)
- 4. The best sportsman on each team. (Decision by team-mates) Vote based on (1) sportsmanship, (2) team spirit and (3) ability.
- 5. The most improved player in the Farm Club. (Decision by Mr. S. Byrd and Assistants)
