We always credited Gary Mossburg with the idea that won the game---that of placing short-stop between first and second when Bill Sudoff came up to bat. That game was the source of many & chuckle over the years, the last time being weeks ago as the tow sat at our kitchen table going over a scale model Bob was building of an invention Fud had patented. Paseball crept into their conversations, no matter what they were doing.

Pob was justly proud of the new umpire association, which he founded, and was zealous in his efforts to make it a good and lasting unit that would fulfill the needs of the community. It must not falter nor fail with his passing because that would be a shamefull waste of time out of a man's life, time that he could have spent sitting in his easy chair instead of creating more work for himself.

To Joyce and their son^S Tom, Steve and Gary, we offer the sympathy of the entire League and wish with all our hearts that this bitter cup could have passed from them. When words fail us, our hearts are full. God keep you in the palm of His Mand.

When first invited to write about Bob Busseau for this edition of the Pulletin, I accepted readily because there arcso many things to say about a man of his quality. As I sought to organize my thoughts, it became apparent that mere words are so inadequate to depict or portray such a dedicated human being. There's no doubt about it, I have not touched upon many important things he contributed. These are just random thoughts about a Quiet-Voiced Man.
