David N. Ware, 51, of Lambertville, MI, died suddenly Thursday, October 23, 1997, on the fifth green at Tamaron Country Club, Toledo.

Born September 5, 1946, in Toledo, he was the son of Basil and Letha Ware of Samaria. He married Patsy Busby on September 22, 1967 in Corpus Christi, TX.

He was employed as a maintenance scheduler for GM Powertrain Division in Toledo for 30 years and was a veteran of the Navy, serving during the Vietnam War. He was a member of the GM Powertrain golf league and served as president.

He was a 1964 graduate of Bedford High School where he played football, ran

track and set and still holds the record in poll vaulting. He also attended Owens Technical College, Davis Business College, the University of Toledo and Wayne State University. His hobbies included golfing, fishing and biking.

He is survived by his wife Patsy; daughters Kimberly (Rich) Taylor of Sylvania, Ohio and Jennifer (Joe) Brower of Toledo, Ohio; parents Basil and Letha Ware of Samaria; sister Barbara (Douglas) Dove of Decatur, Illinois; father and mother-in law, Jack and Mabel Busby of Mathis, Texas; nephews, Stephen and Alex Dove of Downers Grove, Illinois and his granddaughter, Jessica. He was preceded in death by his grandparents.
