

Evelyn Krauss

December 3, 1913 – August 23, 2002

Evelyn Krauss, who will be remembered fondly as a teacher, mother, and grandmother, and as a friend to many in the Toledo community, died August 23, 2002, in the Wexner Nursing Home in Columbus. The widow of Martin I. Krauss, she was 88 years of age. She had been transferred to the Wexner Nursing Home from Darlington House in Toledo less than two weeks before her death.

Evelyn was born December 3, 1913, in New York City shortly after the emigration of her parents from Europe. By 1915, the family had settled in Toledo. Evelyn graduated from the University of Toledo, where she was a member of both the German and Spanish Clubs, in 1935. After graduation and until her marriage to Martin Krauss, she was employed as a secretary in Toledo law offices.

The Krauss family, which then included three children, moved in 1953 to Bowling Green, home of the Midwest Stamping Co., which Martin was a vice president. In 1958, Evelyn was widowed by the early death of Martin, and the family moved back to Toledo.

Evelyn returned to UT to earn her teaching credentials, and for 12 years after that taught shorthand and typing at Bedford High School. After retiring from teaching, she devoted years to transcribing braille for textbooks for the blind. She also was engaged as a volunteer at B'nai Israel Synagogue, and enjoyed playing bridge.

Surviving are a daughter, Dr. Barbara McEwan Landau, of Redlands, California; sons, Edward Krauss, of Columbus, and Bernard Krauss, of Kalamazoo, Michigan; grandchildren, Arnold, Leah, Martin and Joshua Krauss and Matthew McEwan; a brother, William Rosenberg of Toledo, and a cousin, Rose Cohen.

Services will be at 10 a.m. Tuesday at the Robert Wick Funeral Home, Reynolds Rd., followed by a graveside ceremony at Beth Shalom Cemetery. There will be a visitation for family and friends at 2 p.m. Tuesday at the home of Brenda Swee-ney, 3342 Hughes Blvd. Memorial contributions may be made to B'nai Israel Synagogue or the donor's choice.
