

Harold Starn

June 25, 1912 – June 3, 1964

LAMBERTVILLE – Harold Munn Starn, 51, a Bedford High School teacher 14 years, died of a heart attack yesterday in his home at 3235 Linda Lane in Lambertville.

The son of Harold and Marie Starn, he was born June 25, 1912, in Portage, Ohio. He married Patricia Whitt July 23, 1949, in Gallipolis, Ohio. Mr. Starn lived in Toledo before moving to Lambertville 12 years ago. During World War II he was with the Seabees, serving in the South Pacific.

Mr. Starn was a graduate of Libbey High School, Toledo. He received a bachelor of education degree from the University of Toledo in 1949 and a master's degree from the university in 1952.

After teaching a year in Richfield Township, Ohio, he joined the Bedford Township school system. He taught general mathematics and driver education at the time of his death. Mr. Starn was director of transportation at the Bedford Public Schools from 1958 to 1960. At one time he taught industrial arts. He also served as part-time attendance officer and tutored students. He was the only person in the vicinity licensed to administer the Benet Test for Intelligence.

He was Bedford's first driver training teacher and was active in the program from its beginning.

Active in school affairs, Mr. Starn was a member of the Michigan Education Association and the Bedford Education Association. He was a member of Toledo Lodge 144, F.&A.M.

Surviving are his wife, Patricia; his mother Mrs. Marie Munn of Fresno, Calif.; two sons, Harold Michael and Richard Bruce and two daughters, Susan Marie and Jill Ann, all at home; and a brother, Richard Starn of Fresno.

Services will be ar 1:30 p.m Saturday in the Farnham Funeral Home in Temperance. Graveside services will be at 3 p.m. In Portage Cemetery in Portage, Ohio. Masonic memorial services will be conducted at 8 p.m. Tomorrow in the funeral home.
