Through the 1970s and 1980s and into the 1990s, Mr. Caruso was among the region's elite long-distance runners, winning numerous events, including the 1980, 1981, and 1983 Blade 10,000-meter Run.

He estimates that he has completed 30 to 40 half marathons and as many as 18 marathons during his lengthy running career. Mr. Caruso, who lives in Holland in Lucas County, is still an active runner and runs 55 to 60 miles a week.
