Resident Dies

TEMPERANCE — Henry William Hachman, 79, of 256 W. Dean Rd., Temperance, owner of Hachman Farm Supply of Temperance and Deerfield, died early today in Flower Hospital, Toledo, after a long illness.

Mr. Hachman has been a resident of Temperance for the past 78 years, he was a charter member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Temperance, a Sunday school superintendent and active in the Lutheran Brotherhood of Toledo.

He was the first fire chief of the Bedford Township Volunteer Fire Department, a World War I veteran, a member of Sherman H. Osborne Post 192, American Legion; Samaria

Lodge 438, F&AM; past member of Rotary Club, Past secretary and treasurer of South Eastern Mutual Insurance Co. and manager of a branch office of Secretary of State branch office in Temperance.

Friends may call after 2 p.m. Sunday in the Bedford Chapel and until 10 a.m. Tuesday when the body will be taken to St. Paul's Lutheran Church, to lie in state until services at 2 p.m. The Rev. William Paul will officiate and burial will be in Bedford Memorial Cemetery. Memorials may be made to St. Paul's building fund.

The son of Wilhelm and Elizabeth Hachman, he was born March 23, 1895, in Toledo. He married Mabel Hoffman on Nov. 29, 1922, by the Rev. Franklin B. Strobel at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Toledo.

Surviving are his wife; two daughters, Mrs. John (Dorothy) Studnicka of Adrian and Mrs. Robert (Geraldine) Mannor of Temperance; a brother, Edward Hachman of Temperance; two sisters, Mrs. Anna Freer of Toledo and Mrs. Lucille Ward of Luna Pier; and five grandchildren.

Mr. Hachman was preceded in death by his parents, two brothers and two sisters.
