The Bedford High School Hall of Fame Welcomes the following 2005 Inductees

ROBERT BOEHME

Robert Boehme is 1951 graduate of Bedford High School. He was a star athlete playing quarterback in football, guard in basketball, and pitcher in baseball. He led the Mules football team to their only undefeated season in the history of the school. In the spring of 1951, Robert received a letter from the athletes, coaches, and students of Airport High School which congratulated and honored Robert as their greatest adversary over the previous three years. Robert will long be remembered as one of Bedford's greatest athletes. Welcome, Bob, to the Bedford High School Hall of Fame.

DENNIS BRIGHTON

Dennis Brighton is a 1974 graduate of Bedford High School. He is a two-time state wrestling champion, bring home the title in 1973 & 1974. During the summer between his junior and senior years in high school, Denny won 3rd place in the Junior World Olympics. He went on to Michigan State University where he was an NCAA runner-up. He was the Varsity Wrestling Coach at Whitmer High School, and continues today as the Head Coach of the 11-time State Champion Bedford Kicking Mules. GARY DUHAIME

Gary Duhaime taught English at Bedford High School for thirty years. He also coached basketball, tennis, and boys & girls cross country, leading the Lady Mules to the State Championship in 1982. He has a long list of coaching accolades including: 2 district basketball championships, 15 league and 7 regional championships in cross country, a region title in tennis, and numerous other awards. Gary has survived a heart attack, prostate and colon cancer, and hip and knee replacements, yet still plays tennis six days a week. Welcome, Gary, to the Bedford High School Hall of Fame

LEWIS HORN

Lew Horn taught English and Journalism at Bedford High School for thirty-five years. From 1986-2005 he served as Newspaper & Yearbook Adviser, and during this time these publications won numerous awards and accolades. Lew also coached football for ten years, and track for 34 years, winning four region titles and earning runner-up honors twice. His 34 years as Head Coach for the Boys Track Team is a Bedford High School record for most years in the same sport by any coach. Lew just retired in June, and will begin a term as President of the Great Lakes Interscholastic Press Association. Welcome, Lew, to the Bedford High School Hall of Fame.

ELIZABETH (LIZ) RENIUS

Liz Renius is a 1995 graduate of Bedford High School. She was am eight-time Varsity Letter Winner, earning letters in basketball and volleyball. She was First Team All State in 1994 and 1995, Monroe Guardian Volleyball Player of the Year in 1994 and 1995, Monroe Guardian Basketball Player of the Year in 1994, and the list goes on and on. Her school records in volleyball include: Most Assists, Digs, and Aces in a season and Most Assists, Digs, and Aces in a Career.
