

# Jankow Fans 16, Gives Up One Hit

TEMPERANCE — Jim Jankow, making his first start of the season, held Whitmer to one hit, walked one and struck out 16 in pitching the Bedford Mules to a 3-2 victory in the Great Lakes League opener here yesterday.

Jankow was in great form as he retired the Whitmer batters on strikes in the first, fourth and seventh innings.
