## **Bedford Township sewer rates to jump 15 percent in 2017**

BEDFORD TOWNSHIP —

Bedford Township sewer line customers will see quarterly bills jump by about 15 percent in 2017 for a typical household during rates that the township board

approved Dec. 20. The billing will be \$4.74 per thousand gallons usage, compared to the 2016 rate of \$4.12. A similar increase also is expected in 2018, township treasurer Paul

Francis said at the board meeting.

With a family of three, the typical quarterly bill is \$106. It would then increase to about \$123.

The amounts are based on the proposed budget received from the Monroe County Drain Commissioner; but more significantly, are a look ahead to major repairs and upgrades to the infrastructure that is now nearly

In the meantime, township officials are discussing the possibility of putting sewer bills on a monthly schedule. The South County Water District is currently billing quarterly for water service in Bedford Township and surrounding communities, but
