Bedford forum organizers should have attempted to invite all candidates

I have been told that I should expect this kind of thing in "politics," but I do not agree. We live in America, where every eligible citizen has the opportunity to run for office and, whether you agree or disagree with their opinions, the voters have a right to make their own choices. Trying to control the voters' choice is not democracy.

He alleged Nancy Tienvieri did not include her e-mail address on her affidavit of identity. Someone compiled those e-mails and gave them to him, and he subsequently contacted each candidate about participation in the event.

"It was nothing intentional," he said of Nancy Tienvieri not being included in the event.
